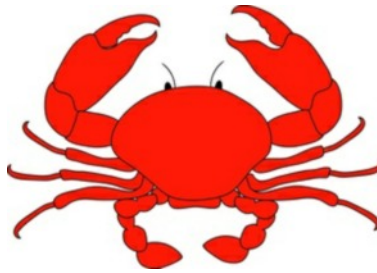

Anneslie Welcomes Dr. Ritter

Approximately eight months ago, long time dentist Dr. Thomas Fahey retired after founding his practice back in 1972 at the corner of York Road and Anneslie. Dr. Jesse Ritter took over and began his practice there last September. Given the recent emergence of several new entrepreneurs along our primary business corridor we thought it would be a great time to introduce Dr. Ritter to the neighborhood. We sat down with him recently to discuss a variety of topics....

AT: Did you grow up always wanting to be a dentist, or was that something that developed later on?

DRR: I have always enjoyed helping people and at Penn State University I knew that I wanted to pursue Pre-Med, but wasn't certain of the specific area. My first year we had a Pre-Med seminar with speakers from several different areas of medicine. One speaker in particular stood out that day because of his passion for his profession. He was a dentist and right there my interest was piqued that I should consider dentistry. I enjoy the satisfaction of knowing someone can come into the office experiencing pain and they can leave feeling a lot better.

AT: Worst type of candy for your teeth?

The ACTC serves people in 18 zip codes throughout Baltimore County and City.

Items may be left in the container found on the front porch of the drop off site. Thank you in advance for selflessly serving those in need.
