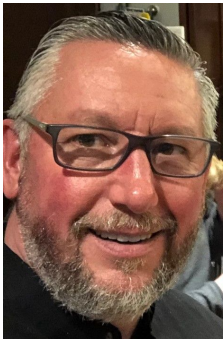

Houses with the front and back porch lights off. Those with front yards littered with bikes and scooters, and plastic dump trucks. Garage doors wide open. Newspapers piled on the front steps. No interior lights on. And who can tell how many car doors are unlocked at eleven o'clock at night?

These are all signs to would-be thieves that you're either not home, a little careless with your property, or a little too distracted to remain vigilant. These are all also very easy things to correct and make ourselves less likely to be targets.

If you're going away, have a neighbor bring in your mail and papers. Put a few of your interior lights on timers or "smart plugs". ALWAYS leave your front and back porch lights on at night. Especially with new LED bulbs, it doesn't cost much and makes your home just a little less appealing as a potential target. And, please, please, please, stop leaving the car unlocked. The guys rummaging through cars parked in the street are looking for easy access to change and your stuff – they're not going to smash windows to get it, they're just going to walk along until they find the next unlocked door.

We've been fortunate that the Baltimore County Police are so very responsive to reports of crime in Anneslie, but they cannot do it all themselves. They rely heavily on us to do whatever we can to minimize the easy "crimes of convenience", so that they can focus on the big stuff.

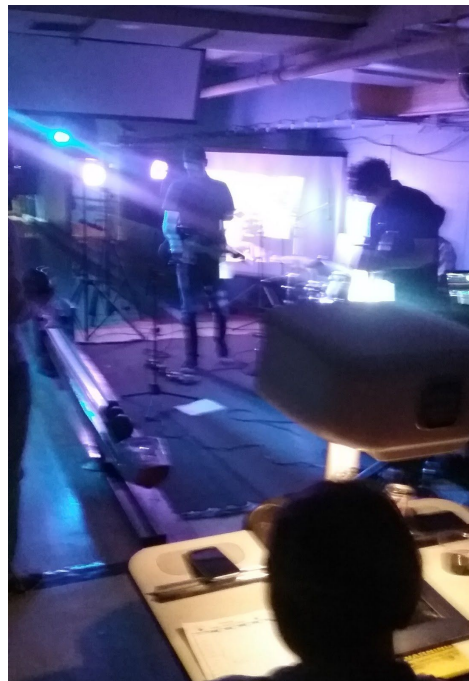
